APPLES．
Canadian applas held in Cold and Ccmon storage，including stocks held by comneroial growers，wero 206，007 barrels， 906,266 boxes and 252,674 bushols in other containors．Converting all containers to bushels the combinod fi；弓ures were $1,776,861$ bushols as comparod with 575,123 bushels at March 1， 1942 and $3,302,728$ bushels last month．Tho apparent not＂0utmofmstorage＂ movement was 1.5 million bushols．

PEARS Canadian poars，in Cold and Common storage，including those in
the hands of commercial growors，amounted to 1,614 bushels．
In addition thero wore 6,480 bushels Imported on hand．
FROZEN AND SOz FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen，two parts
fruitit to ono part sugar，three parts fruit to one part sugar， and as pulp．The total was 6，203，943 lb ．（including an estimas of $250,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．）as comm pared with 4.5 million $1 b$ ，last year and 6.6 million $1 b$ ．last month．

Fruit in $\mathrm{SO}_{2}$ totallod $11,209,194 \mathrm{lb}$ ．including on estimate of 4 million lb 。 for firms failing to roport on timo．

Frozen and $\mathrm{SO}_{2}$ fruit combined woro $17,413,137 \mathrm{lb}$ ．including the estimato．The combinod friguros last year at tho same dato were $13,739,528 \mathrm{lb}$ ． Including the ostimato there was an apparont net＂Out－of－Storage＂movement of 1.8 million lboduring Fobruary 1943．During February 1942 there was a similar movement of 1.0 million $1 b_{0}$

VEGETABLES Holdings of Canadian－grown vegotables wore as follows：
Potato holdings amounted to 134,805 thons there being an＂Out－ ofmstorage＂movement of 36.9 thousand tons，as compared with a similar movement of 30.4 thousand tons last yoar．Thore wore also 130 tons of Imported potatoes on hand．

Onions stocks were reported as 9,604 tons，as comparod with
5,353 tons at the same dato last year，and 12,059 tons on February 1，1943．Inaddition there were 9 tons of Imported stock．

Celery．Thero were 1，738 orates of Canadian Celery and 11，116
crates of Imparted on hand。
Other Vogetables were reported as follows：Beets 488 tons； Cabbige 2，614 tons；Carrots 459 tons；Parsnips 436 tons．In addition to these Camadian stocke there wore Impartod holdings of 4 tons Beots， 122 tons Carbages，and 104 tons carrots．

FROZEN VEGETABLES Frozen Vegetables totalled 1，024，590 lb 。being Peas 637，614 Ib．，String Beans $75,145 \mathrm{lb}$ ，and Other Vogetables $311,831 \mathrm{lb}$ ，No separation is mado of retail and whole serie containers．

The total on the carresponding date last year was $1,195,272 \mathrm{lb}$ ． There was a decrease from last month of $162,870 \mathrm{lb}$ ．
