STOCKS OF CANADIAN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MAY 1, 1943

APPLES Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including stocks held by commercial growers, were 5,857 barrels, 268,811 boxes and 37,435 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 323,817 bushels as compared with 96,759 bushels at May 1, 1942 and 761,013 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 437 thousand bushels. The Imported stocks amounted to 13,725 bushels.

PEARS

There were no Canadian pears in storage on May 1, 1945. There were, however, 4,595 bushels Imported on hand.

FROZEN AND SO2 FRUIT Frozen fruit stocks are shown as straight frozen, two parts fruit to one part sugar, three parts fruit to one part sugar and as pulp. The total was 4,275,995 lb. (including an estimate of 80 thousand 1b,) as compared with 3,3 million 1b. last year and 5,4 million 1b. last month.

Fruit in SO2 totalled 9,346,451 lb. including an estimate of 2,4 million lb, for firms failing to report on time.

Frozen and SOz fruit combined were 13,622,446 lb. including the estimate, The combined figures last year at the same date were 9,587,790 lb. Including the estimate there was an apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.5 million 1b, during April 1943. During April 1942 there was a similar movement of 2.7 million 1b.

VEGETABLES Potato holdings amounted to 60,479 tone, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 34.2 thousand tons, as compared with similar movement of 15.6 thousand tons last year. There were also 6 tons of Imported potatoes on hand.

Onions stocks were reported as 4,806 tons, as compared with 881 tons at the same date last year, and 6,151 tons on April 1, 1943.

Celery. There were 97 crates of Canadian Celery and 5,187 crates of Imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 193 tons; Cabbage 15 tons; Carrots 1,863 tons; Parsnips 174 tons. In addition to these Canadian stocks there were Imported holdings of 4 tons Beets, 27 tons Cabbages and 305 tons Carrots.

FROZEN VEGETABLES Frozen Vegetables totalled 414,652 lb. being Peas 211,718 lb. String Beans 40,773 1b. and Other Vegetables 162,161 1b. No separation is made of retail and wholesale containers,

The total on the corresponding date last year was 1,065,192 1b. There was a decrease from last month of 3 24.7 thousand 1b.


