## STOCKS OF FRITI AND VEGETABIES，APRIL 1 ． 1944

APPLES Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage，including holdings in the hands of comercial growers，were 36,300 barrels， 401,027
boxes and 117,684 bushels in other containers．Converting all con－ tainers to bushels the combined figures were 621，611 bushels as compared with 761，013 hushels at April 1， 1943 and 1， 178,270 bushels last month．The apparent net＂Out－of－ Storage＂movement was 557 thousand bushels．In addition there were 30 bushels of imported apples on hand．

PEARS There were no pears in storage．

FROZEN FRUTT There were $520,176 \mathrm{lb}$ ．frust in Consumer Packages（including an estimate of $19,000 \mathrm{lbs}$ ．）as compared with $785,925 \mathrm{lb}$ ．last month， pilifile for re－procecning purposes the total of all frozen fruits was $9,840,749 \mathrm{lb}$ ．including an estimate of $2.32 \mathrm{n}^{\text {n }}$ Ilion lb ．As imported fruits，including citrus fruits，are now included a comparison cannot be made with previous years，but the total for last month was $10,587,688 \mathbf{1 3}$ ．

FRUIT IN PRESERVATIVES The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 17，022，592 lb ．（including an estimate of 8.0 million 1 b 。） as compared with $16,762,252$ million 16 ．Iast month．

VEGETABLES Holdings of Canadian－grown vegetables including stocks in the hands of commercial growers，were as follows：

Potato holdings amounted to 137,603 tons，there being an＂Out－of－ Storage＂movement of 47 thousand tons．

Onion stocks were reported as 838 tons，as compared with 6，151 tons at the some date last year，and 1，733 tons on March 1， 1944.

Celey．There were 68 crates of Canadian Celery and 26,157 crates of imported on hand．

Other Vegetables were reported as follows：Beets 263 tons；Cabbage 421 tons；Carrots 2，792 tons and Persnips 245 tons．In addition there were 241 tons of Imported Beets， 526 tons Cabbage；and 24 tons Carrots．

FROZEN VEGETABIES
The nem Consumer Packages classification showed a total of．811，641 lb．of which $500,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．were estimated for late firms．Ther were also 245，797 1b．for Re－processing purposes．Included in this amount mere $55,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．as an estimate．
