STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, APRIL 1. 1944

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including holdings in the hands of commercial growers, were 36,300 barrels, 401,027 boxes and 111,684 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 621,611 bushels as compared with 761,013 bushels at April 1, 1943 and 1,178,270 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 557 thousand bushels. In addition there were 30 bushels of imported apples on hand.

PEARS

There were no pears in storage.

FROZEN FRUIT

There were 520,176 lb. fruit in Consumer Packages (including an estimate of 19,000 lbs.) as compared with 785,925 lb. last month, while for re-processing purposes the total of all frozen fruits was 9,940,749 lb. including an estimate of 2.32 million lb. As imported fruits, including citrus fruits, are now included a comparison cannot be made with previous years, but the total for last month was 10,587,688 1b.

FRUIT IN PRESERVATIVES The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 17,022,592 lb. (including an estimate of 8.0 million lb.) as compared with 16,762,252 million lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables including stocks in the hands of commercial growers, were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 137,603 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 47 thousand tons.

Onion stocks were reported as 838 tons, as compared with 6,151 tons at the same date last year, and 1,733 tons on March 1, 1944.

Celery. There were 68 crates of Canadian Celery and 26,157 crates imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 263 tons; Cabbage 421 tons; Carrots 2,792 tons and Parsnips 245 tons. In addition there were 241 tons of Imported Beets, 526 tons Cabbage; and 424 tons Carrots.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

The new Consumer Packages classification showed a total of 811,641 1b. of which 500,000 lb. were estimated for late firms. There were also 245,797 lb. for Re-processing purposes. Included in this amount were 55,000 lb. as an estimate.

There were 440,000 lb. vegetables held in brine for Re-processing VEGETABLES IN BRINE purposes.
