STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JUNE 1, 1944

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, including holdings in the hands of commercial growers, were 2,537 barrels, 54,642 boxes and 11,664 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 73,917 bushels, as compared with 120,826 bushels at June 1, 1943 and 223,626 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 150 thousand bushels.

FROZEN FRUIT

There were 390,176 lb. fruit in Consumer Packages (including an estimate of 100,000 lbs.) as compared with 671,138 lb. last month, while for re-processing purposes, the total of all frozen fruits was 7,966,150 lb. including an estimate of 2.5 million lb. for firms failing to report on time. As Imported fruits, including citrus fruits, are now included, a comparison cannot be made with previous years, but the total for last month was 9,157,483 lb.

FRUIT IN PRESERVATIVES

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,533,564 lb. (including an estimate of 4.2 million lb.) as compared with 15.8 million lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including stocks in the hands of commercial growers, were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 41,749 tons, there being an "Outof-Storage" movement of 63 thousand tons, as compared with a similar movement of 36 thousand tons last year.

Onion stocks were reported as 69 tons, as compared with 1,353 tons at the same date last year, and 147 tons on May 1, 1944.

Celery. There were 48 crates of Canadian Celery and 2,872 crates of imported on hand.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 33 tons; Cabbage 14 tons; Carrots 874 tons and Parsnips 33 tons. In addition there were 127 tons of imported Beets, 383 tons Cabbage; 743 tons Carrots; 1,608 tons Onions and 2 tons Parsnips.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

The Consumer Packages classification showed a total of 430,873 lb. There were also 149,945 lb. for Re-processing purposes. Included in this amount were 57,000 lb. as an estimate.

VEGETABLES IN BRINE

There were 187,035 lb. vegetables held in brine for Re-processing purposes including an estimate of 50,000 lb. for firms that failed to report on time.
