STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, SEPTEMBER 1, 1944

ATFLDS

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, at A. First Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, at distributing centres only, were 256 barrels, 23,138 boxes and 3,834 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the com-bined figures were 27,740 bushels as compared with 23,518 bushels at September 1, 1943 and 9,340 bushels last month. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement was 18.4 thousand bushels. In addition there were 97 bushels of imported apples on hand.

There were 13,083 bushels of Canadian and 4,100 bushels of imported pears in stock.

FROMEN FRUIT There were 1,721,349 lb. fruit in Consumer Fackages (includ-ing an estimate of 220,000 lbs.) as compared with 790,888 lb. last month while for re-processing rurposes the total of all frozen fruits was 8,605,766 lb. including an estimate of 80 thousand lb. As imported fruits, including citrus fruits, are new included a comparison cannot be made with previous years, but the total for last month was 10,659,919 lb.

FRUIT IN PRESERVATIVES	The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 19,560,115 lb. (including an estimate of with 18,034,108 lb. last month.
VEGETABLES	Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables at distributing centres only were as follows:
	Totato holdings amounted to 1,323 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 649 tons.
	<u>Onion</u> stocks were reported as 557 tons, as compared with 540 tons at the same date last year, and 304 tons on August 1, 1944.
	Celery. There were 2,487 crates of Canadian Celery on hand as compared with 1,454 last month and 2,176 crates last year.
	Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets CC tons:

Cabbage 84 tons; Carrots 132 tons and Farsnips C tons. In addition there were 50 tons of Imported onions.

FROZEN VEGETABLES

The Consumer Packages classification showed a total of 1,281,739 lb. of which 60,000 lb. were estimated for late firms. There were also 1,286,049 1b. for Re-processing purposes. Included in this amount were 80,000 lb. as an estimate.

VEGETABLES IN BRINE

There were 621,325 lb. vegetables held in brine for Re-processing purposes.
