APPLES Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including holdings by commercial growers, were 538,471 barrels, 1,698,470 boxes and 538,850 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 3,852,733 bushels as compared with 2,608,399 bushels at February 1, 1944 and 5,844,494 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 2.0 million bushels.

PEARS

There were 4,607 bushels of Canadian and 10,421 bushels of imported pears in stock.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN <u>PRESERVATIVES</u>. B,349,379 lb. including an estimate of 337 thousand lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 19,945,612 lb. (including an estimate of 8.5 million lb.)

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 28,708,270 lb. as compared with 29,309,034 lb. last year and 30,549,014 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including holdings by Commercial growers were as follows:

<u>Potato</u> holdings amounted to 259,080 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 75,000 tons. f_{π}

<u>Onion</u> stocks were reported as 16,235 tons, as compared with 3,316 tons at the same date last year, and 20,023 tons on January 1.

<u>Celery</u>. There were 13,480 crates of Canadian Celery on hand as compared with 67,314 last month and 24,341 crates last year.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 1,402 tons; Carrots 5,864 tons; Cabbages 3,540 tons and Parsnips 1,255 tons.

In addition there were imported stocks on hand of 39 tons potatoes, 109 tons onions, 1 ton beets, 57 tons carrots, 27 tons cabbages and 11,269 crates of celery.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND <u>IN BRINE</u> also 1,256,317 lb. of bulk and over 10 lb.

There were 3,221,492 lb. vegetables held in brine.
