STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, MAY 1, 1945

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including holdings by commercial growers, were 11,209 barrels, 187,437 boxes APPLES and 61,227 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 282,291 bushels as compared with 223,626 bushels at May 1, 1944 and 885,554 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 603 thousand bushels. In addition there were on hand 1,216 bushels of imported apples.

PEARS

There were 433 bushels of imported pears in stock.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN There were 244.512 lb. fruit in "Packages 10 lb. and under" while for bulk and containers "Over 10 lb." the total was 7,773,195 lb., PRESERVATIVES including an estimate of 1 million 1b.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 13,407,963 lb. (including an estimate of 4 million lb.)

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 21,425,670 lb. as compared with 25,698,017 lb. last year and 24,255,482 lb. last month.

VEGET ABLES

Holdings of Canadian-grown vegetables, including holdings by Commercial growers were as follows:

Potato Holdings amounted to 60,763 tons, there being an "Outof-Storage" movement of 70 thousand tons. There were also 59 tons of imported potatoes on hand.

Onion stocks were reported as 4,683 tons, as compared with 147 tons at the same date last year, and 8,432 tons on April 1.

<u>Celery</u>. There were only 83 crates of Canadian Celery on hand but there were 7,895 crates of imported stocks.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 114 tons; Carrots 1,591 tons; Cabbages 72 tons and Parsnips 248 tons.

In addition there were imported stocks on hand of 40 tons beets, 413 tons carrots and 326 tons cabbages.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages 10 lb. and under" showed a total of 221,091 lb.
There were also 1,170,545 lb. of bulk and "Over 10 lb."

There were 1,020,024 lb. of vegetables held in brine.
