### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JUNE 1, 1945

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage in-APPLES cluding holdings by commercial growers, were 1,163 barrels, 35,614 boxes and 9,342 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 48,445 bushels as compared with 73,917 bushels at June 1, 1944 and 282,291 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out of Storage" movement was 234 thousand bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN There were 153,465 lb, fruit in "Packages 10 lb, and PRESERVATIVES under" while for bulk and containers "Over 10 1b." the total was 5,532,880 lb. including an estimate of 420 thousand lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,572,827 lb. (including an estimate of 3.5 million lb.)

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 17,259,172 lb. as compared with 22,200,729 lb. last year and 21,194,823 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, including holdings by Commercial growers were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 28,590 tons, there being an "Out of Storage" movement of 32,000 tohs. There were also 216 tons of Imported stock.

> Onion stocks were reported as 2,319 tons, as compared with 69 tons at the same date last year, and 4,683 tons

on May 1.

Celery. There was no Canadian Celery on hand. There were however, 9,212 crates of imported.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 98 tons; Carrots 1,328 tons; Cabbages 21 tons and Parsnips 99 tons.

In addition there were imported stocks on hand of 10 tons onions, 55 tons beets, 78 tons carrots and 249

tons cabbages.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND "Packages 10 lb. and under " showed a total of 204,518 lb. of which 40,000 lb. were estimated for late firms. There IN BRINE were also 1,065,271 lb. of bulk and "Over 10 lb."

There were 317,021 lb. vegetables held in brine.
