Potato holdings amounted to 28,590 tons: there being an "Out of Storage" movement of 32,000 tons. There
were also 216 tons of Imported stock.
Onion stocks were reported as 2,319 tons; as compared with 69 tons at the same date last year: and 4,683 tons on May 1.

Celery. There was no Canadian Celery on hand. There wete however, 9.212 crates of imported.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 98 tons Carrots 1,328 tons; Cabbages 21 tons and Parsnips 99 tons

In addition there were imported stocks on hand of 10 tons onions, 55 tons beets, 78 tons carrots and 249
tons cabbages.
