STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES, JULY 1, 1945

APPLES Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage at distributing centres only were 113 barrels, 4,807 boxes and 1,287 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 6,433 bushels as compared with 10,081 bushels at July 1, 1944 and 48,445 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 42 thousand bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES There were 247,806 lb. fruit in "Packages 10 lb. and under" while for bulk and containers "Over 10 1b." the total was 7,156,553 lb. including an estimate of 3 million lb. for firms whose reports were late.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,411,001 lb. (including an estimate of 2.5 million lb.)

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 18,815,360 lb. as compared with 22,802,618 lb. last year and 17,554,625 lb. last month.

VEGET ABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, at distributing Centres only were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 1,595 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 27,000 tons. There were also 249 tons of Imported stock.

Onion stocks were reported as 262 tons, as compared with 52 tons at the same date last year, and 2,319 tons on June 1 this year.

Celery. There were 2,047 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. There were also 4,594 crates of imported stocks.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 28 tons; Carrots 33 tons; Cabbages 127 tons and Parsnips 5 tons.

In addition there were imported stocks on hand of 3 tons onions, 7 tons beets, 56 tons carrots and 20 tons Cabbages,

VEGETABLES, FORZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages 10 lb. and under" showed a total of 190,342 lb. There were also 1,062,054 lb. of bulk and "Over 10 lb." including an estimate of 1,000,000 lb. for firms whose reports were late.

There were 250,000 lb. vegetables held in brine.
