

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES FEBRUARY 1, 1946

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including holdings by commercial growers, were 9,817 barrels, 911,470 boxes and 60,778 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 1,001,899 bushels as compared with 3,852,733 bushels at February 1, 1945 and 1,736,044 bushels last month. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 734 thousand bushels.

PEARS

There were on hand 3,403 bushels of Canadian pears and 11,241 bushels of Imported.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 373,607 lb. fruit in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 8,133,308 lb. including an estimate of 364 thousand lb. for firms whose reports were late.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 15,020,168 lb. (including an estimate of 2,837,000 lb.). A year ago they amounted to 19,700,923 lb. and last month to 15,650,779 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 23,527,083 lb. as compared with 27,675,678 lb. last year and 25,014,980 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, including holdings by commercial growers, were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 186,587 tons, there being an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 59 thousand tons. In addition there were imported stocks amounting to 10,297 tons.

Onion stocks were reported as 7,515 tons, as compared with 16,235 tons at the same date last year and 11,293 tons on January 1, this year. There were also 12 tons of imported stocks.

Celery. There were 7,398 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 13,480 crates. On January 1, Canadian stocks were 33,577 crates. There were also 25,764 crates of Imported Celery on February 1, 1946.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 478 tons; Carrots 5,496 tons; Cabbages 1,815 tons and Parsnips 679 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb" showed a total of 452,500 lb. There were also 2,529,857 lb. "10 lb. and Over" and 857,500 lb. held in Brine.
