STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES MAY 1, 1946

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage including holdings by Commercial growers, were 700 barrels, 54,855 boxes and 4,251 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 61,206 bushels as compared with 282,291 bushels at May 1, 1945 and 278,971 bushels last month. The apparent net *Out-of-Storage" movement was 218 thousand bushels.

PEARS

There were on hand 506 bushels of Canadian pears and 1,735 bushels of Imported.

FRUIT. FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 108,052 lb. fruit in *Packages Under 10 1b. " while for "10 1b. and Over" the total

was 4,970,720 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 10,310,061 lb. (including an estimate of 780,000 lb.). A year ago they amounted to 14,465,687 lb. and last month to 11,541,065 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 15,388,833 lb. as compared with 21,946,857 lb. last year and 17,706,042 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Cahadian grown vegetables, including holdings by commercial growers were as follows:

Potato holdings amounted to 65,897 tons, there being "Out-of-Storage" movement of 34 thousand In addition there were imported stocks amounting to 9,077 tons.

Onion stocks were reported as 867 tons, as compared with 4,683 tons at the same date last year and 2,952 tons on April 1, this year. There were also 241 tons of imported stocks.

Celery. There were 42 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 83 crates. On April 1, Canadian stocks were 523 crates. There were also 18,654 crates of Imported Celery on May 1, 1946.

Other Vegetables were reported as follows: Beets 111 tons; Carrots 1,206 tons; Cabbages 65 tons and Parsnips 120 tons.
