STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES January 1, 1947

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Gold and Common Storage, at distributing centres only were 573,325 barrels, 2,305,277 boxes and 440,298 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 4,465,550 bushels as compared with 1,736,044 bushels at January 1, 1946 and 7,360,606 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 2,9 million bushels.

PRARS

There were 16,135 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand and 6,787 bushels of Imported Pears.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 263,896 lb. of fruit in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 11,944,175 lb. including an estimate of 200,000 thousand lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 17,382,132 lb. (including an estimate of 2,500,000 lb.) A year ago they amounted to 16,360,094 lb. and last month to 17,868,515 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 29,590,203 lb. as compared with 25,871,528 lb. last year and 30,844,176 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, at distributing centres only, were as follows:

POTATO holdings amounted to 467,030 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 69 tons.

ONION stocks were reported as 15,696 tons, as compared with 11.293 tons at the same date last year and 18.040 tons on December 1, 1946.

CELERY There were 89,426 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 33,577 crates. On December 1, 1946 Canadian stocks were 274,514 crates. There were also 4,443 crates of Imported Stocks of Celery on January 1, 1947.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,460 tons, Carrots 11,284 tons, Cabbage 5,223 tons and Parsnips 1,305 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb" showed a total of 919,637 lb. There were also 2,888,706 lb. "10 lb. and Over" and 2,352,613 lb. held in Brine, including an estimate of 100,000 lb.
