### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES MAY 1, 1947

#### APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including holdings by commercial growers, were 6,510 barrels, 162,500 boxes and 29,291 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 211,327 bushels as compared with 61,206 bushels at May 1, 1946 and 500,299 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 289 thousand bushels.

There were also 43,449 bushels of Imported Apples on hand on May 1, 1947.

PEARS

There were 274 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand and 1,814 bushels of Imported Pears.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 235,007 lb. of fruit in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 7,286,636 lb. including an estimate of 190,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoute of sode totalled 13,665,764 lb. (including an estimate of 1,950,000 lb.) A year ago they amounted to 10,093,428 lb. and last month to 16,015,439 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 21,187,407 lb. as compared with 15,172,416 lb. last year and 24,304,329 lb. last month.

#### VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, including holdings by commercial growers were as follows:

POTATO holdings amounted to 143,390 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 127 thousand tons. Stocks of imported potatoes were 1,233tons.

ONION stocks were reported as 1,989 tons, as compared with 867 tons at the same date last year and 4,931 tons on April 1, 1947. There were also 827 tons of Imported stocks.

CELERY There were 4,286 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 42 crates. On April 1, 1947 Canadian stocks were 4,140 crates. There were also 9,109 crates of Imported stocks of Celery on May 1, 1947.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows. Beets 190 tons, Carrots 1,891 tons, Cabbage 384 tons and Parsnips 210 tons Canadian and Imported stocks as Beets 31 tons, Carrots 484 tons, Cabbage 346 tons and Parsnips 9 tons.

## VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb." showed a total of 451,716 lb. while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 1,682,935 lb. and 1,846,181 lb. held in Brine, including an estimate of 80,000 lb.
