STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES JUNE 1, 1947

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, including holdings by commercial growers, were 1,552 barrels, 47,982 boxes and 9,739 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 62,377 bushels as compared with 12,574 bushels at June 1, 1946 and 211,327 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 149 thousand bushels.

There were also 35,443 bushels of Imported Apples on hand on June 1, 1947.

There were 516 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand and 1,515 bushels PEARS of Imported Pears.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 170,927 lb. of fruit in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 5,881,577 lb. including an estimate of 117,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,729,819 lb. (including an estimate of 1,700,000 lb.) A year ago they amounted to 8,812,725 lb. and last month to 13,784,406 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 17,782,322 lb. as compared with 12,977,729 lb. last year and 21,309,120 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, including holdings by commercial growers were as follows:

POTATO holdings amounted to 62,203 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 89 thousand tons. Stocks of imported potatoes were 467 tons.

ONION stocks were reported as 632 tons, as compared with 416 tons at the same date last year and 1,989 tons on May 1, 1947. There were also 758 tons of imported stocks.

CELERY There were 2,548 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 415 crates. On May 1, 1947 Canadian stocks were 4,286 crates. There were also 9,807 crates of Imported stocks of celery on June 1, 1947.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 79 tons, Carrots 1,284 tons, Cabbage 55 tons and Parsnips 67 tons Canadian and Imported stocks as: Beets 70 tons, Carrots 944 tons, Cabbage 181 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb" showed a total of 296,234 lb. while for "10 lb.and Over", the total was 1,886,917 lb. and 1,270,286 lb. held in brine. including an estimate of 70,000 lb.
