

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES JULY 1, 1947

APPLES Canadian apples held in Cold and Common storage, at distributing centres only, were 569 barrels, 11,630 boxes and 1,869 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 15,206 bushels as compared with 2,958 bushels at July 1, 1946 and 62,377 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 47 thousand bushels.

There were also 7,883 bushels of Imported Apples on hand on July 1, 1947.

PEARS There were 150 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand and 2,297 bushels of Imported Pears.

FRUIT FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 209,815 lb. of fruit in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 9,927,820 lb. including an estimate of 200,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,561,975 lb. (including an estimate of 5,000,000 lb.) A year ago they amounted to 10,105,926 lb. and last month to 12,072,463 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 22,699,610 pounds as compared with 17,521,146 lb. last year and 17,069,651 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:

POTATO holdings amounted to 6,211 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 55 thousand tons. Stocks of imported potatoes were 511 tons.

ONION stocks were reported as 403 tons, as compared with 14 tons at the same date last year and 632 tons on June 1, 1947. There were also 1,015 tons of Imported Stocks.

CELERY There were 2,057 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 2,377 crates. On June 1, 1947 Canadian stocks were 2,548 crates. There were also 2,787 crates of Imported Stocks of celery on July 1, 1947.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 15 tons, Carrots 1003 tons, Cabbage 167 tons and Parsnips 15 tons Canadian and Imported stocks as Beets 43 tons, Carrots 442 tons Cabbage 67 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb." showed a total of 280,312 lb. while for "10 lb. and over", the total was 2,265,390 lb. and 3,654,408 lb. held in Brine, including an estimate of 75,000 lb.
