STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - JANUARY 1, 1948

APPLES

Canadian apples held in Cold and Common Storage, at distributing centres only were 534,345 barrels, 2,536,140 boxes and 771,675 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 4,910,850 bushels as compared with 4,465,550 bushels as at January 1, 1947 and 6,545,986 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 1.6 million bushels

PEARS There were 33,261 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand and 458 bushels of Imported Pears.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 242,378 pounds of Fruit, in "Packages Under 10 lb." including an estimate of 14,000 lb. while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 12,085,382 lb. including an estimate of 451,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 15,302,832 lb. In these figures an estimate of 3,777,000 lb. is included. A year ago they amounted 17,971,791 lb. and last month to 17,591,439.lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 27,630,592 lb. as compared with 30,090,961 lb. last year and 30,933,643 lb. last month

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, at distributing centres only were as follows:

POTATO holdings amounted to 375,866 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 72,811 tons.

ONION stocks were reported as 17,228 tons as compared with 15,696 tons at the same date last year and 15,902 tons on December 1, 1947.

CELERY There were 53,489 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at the same date there were 89,426 crates. There were also imported stocks of Celery amounting to 4,447 crates on January 1, 1947 On December 1, 1947 Canadian stocks were 179,428 crates and imported 2,493 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,405 tons, Carrots 8,261 tons Cabbage 2,530 tons and Parsnips 677 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages under 10 lb;" showed a total of 1,329,089 lb. including an estimate of 102,000 lb. while for 10 lb. and over the total was 7,712,652 lb. and there were 6,728,439 lb. held in Brine, including an estimate of 2,642,000 lb.
