## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - NOVEMBER 1, 1948

APPLES Canadian applesheld in cold and common storage, at distributing centres only were 11,319 barrels, 208,716 boxes and 327,150 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 569,823 bushels as compared with 952,356 bushels as at November 1, 1947 and 216,827 bushels last month. The apparent net "into-storage" movement was 352,996 bushels.

There were 92,491 bushels of Pears on hand as compared with 70,635 bushels on November 1, 1947.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 514,116 lb. of Fruit, in "Packages Under 10 lb." while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 17,678,819 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 22,547,435 lb. A year ago they amounted to 22,167,378 lb. and last month to 23,191,610 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 40,740,370 pounds as compared with 39,091,321 lb. last year and 43,353,697 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

were: POTATO

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables, at distributing centres only Stocks of potatoes were 8,127 tons, there being an "into-storage" movement of 5,487 tons.

ONION

Onion holdings were reported as 22,961 tons as compared with 5,878 tons last year and 4,847 tons last month.

CELERY

There were 264,562 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at  $N_{\rm OV}$  ember 1, there were 186,374 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,011 tons, Carrots, 7,109 tons Cabbage 1,695 tons and Parsnips 465 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Packages Under 10 lb." showed a total of 1,393,276 lb. while for "10 lb. and Over" the total was 5,892,398 lb. There were 5,111,637 lb. held in Brine.
