

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES- OCTOBER 1, 1949

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 7,545 barrels, 102,946 boxes and 168,344 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 293,925 bushels as compared with 216,827 bushels as at October 1, 1948 and 25,211 bushels last month. The apparent net "into-storage" movement was 268,714 bushels.

PEARS There were 62,392 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on October 1, 1949.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 387,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 16,223,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 16.019,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 23,193,000 lb. and last month to 14,748,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 34,402,000 lb. as compared with 43,356,000 lb. last year and 33,021,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 2,273 tons, there being an "into storage" movement of 241 tons.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 3,501 tons as compared with 4,847 tons last year and 574 tons last month. There were also 12 tons of imported onions on hand on October 1, 1949.

CELERY There were 83,151 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at October 1, there were 108,793 crates on hand. There were no stocks of imported celery on hand on October 1, 1949.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 114 tons, Carrots 645 tons, Cabbage 248 tons and Parsnips 63 tons. Imported stocks were: Onions 12 and Carrots 31 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 518,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 7,206,000 lb. There were 3,644,000 lb. held "In Brine".
