STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES- NOVEMBER 1, 1949

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 19,383 barrels, 351,201 boxes and 560,608 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 969,958 bushels as compared with 569,823 bushels as at November 1, 1948 and 293,925 bushels last month. The apparent net "into-storage" movement was 676,033 bushels.

PEARS There were 25,202 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand November 1, 1949.

FRUIT. FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 512,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 16,556,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 16,110,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 22,547,000 lb. and last month to 15,915,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 33,178,000 lb. as compared with 41,111,000 lb. last year and 34,518,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

- POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 29,386 tons, there being an "into-storage" movement of 27,113 tons. There were also 14 tons of imported potatoes on hand November 1, 1949.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 15,956 tons as compared with 22,961 tons last year and 3,501 tons last month. There were also 140 tons of imported onions on hand on November 1, 1949.
- CELERY There were 332,804 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at November 1 there were 264,562 crates on hand. There were 66 crates of imported celery on hand on November 1, 1949.
- OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,046 tons, Carrots 2,876 tons, Cabbage 1,537 tons and Parsnips 383 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and Under" showed a total of 705,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 7,582,000 lb. There were 4,423,000 lb. held "In Brine".
