STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - DECEMBER 1, 1949

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 677,288 barrels, 4,996,045 boxes and 1,891,707 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 8,919,616 bushels as compared with 5,129,432 bushels as at December 1, 1948 and 969,958 bushels last month. The apparent net "into-storage" movement was 7,949,658 bushels.

PEARS There were 43,843 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand December 1, 1949.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 394,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for 'Over 1 lb." the total was 15,493,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 14,886,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 21,455,000 lb. and last month to 15,940,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 30,778,000 lb. as compared with 38,270,000 lb. last year and 33,099,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

- POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 686,582 tons, there being an "into-storage" movement of 657,196 tons. There were also 139 tons of imported potatoes on hand December 1, 1949.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 16,778 tons as compared with 22,779 tons last year and 15,956 tons last month. There were also 86 tons of imported onions on hand on December 1, 1949.
- CELERY There were 351,015 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at December 1 there were 197,735 crates on hand. There were 3,032 crates of imported celery on hand on December 1, 1949.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 2,589 tons, Carrots 13,566 tons, cabbage 8,271 tons and Parsnips 2,298 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and Under" showed a total of 635,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb. the total was 7,669,000 lb. There were 3,894,000 lb. held "In Brine".
