STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - FEBRUARY 1, 1949

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage, were 37,662 barrels 1,536,269 boxes and 440,774 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 2,090,029 bushels as compared with 3,415,751 bushels as at February 1, 1948 and 3,290,593 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 1,200,564 bushels.

There were 41,637 bushels of Pears on hand as compared with 16,873 bushels on February 1, 1948.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 523,000 lb. of Fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 14,006,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 21,055,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 18,827,000 lb. and last month to 20,517,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 35,534,000 lb. as compared with 30,594,000 lb. last year and 36,382,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 344,796 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 65,047 tons.

ONION

Onion holdings were reported as 15,615 tons as compared with 8,200 tons last year and 20,324 tons last month. There were also 196 tons of imported onions on hand February 1, 1949.

CELERY

There were 3,459 crates of canadian celery on hand. Last year at February 1 there were 2,770 crates. Imported stocks on hand February 1, 1949 amounted to 13,273 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets, 1690 tons, Carrots 12,879 tons
Cabbage 3,758 tons and Parsnips 864 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 674,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 4,534,000 lb. There were 4,143,000 lb. held in Brine.
