STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - MARCH 1, 1949

## APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage, were 18,067 barrels 987,978 boxes and 310,708 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 1,352,887 bushels as compared with 1,979,824 bushels as at March 1, 1948 and 2,090,029 bushels last month. The apprent net "out-of-storage" movement was 737,142 bushels.

#### PEARS

There were 17,884 bushels of pears on hand as compared with 7,326 bushels on March 1, 1948.

### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 249,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and under" while for "over 1 lb." the total was 12,422,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 20,428,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 19,036,000 lb. and last month to 21.049.000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 35,211,000 lb. as compared with 30,060,000 lb. last year and 37,245,000 lb. last month.

### VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 281,233 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 63.563 tons.

## ONION

Onion holdings were reported as 11,257 tons as compared with 4,898 tons last year and 15,615 tons last month. There were also 138 tons of imported onions on hand March 1, 1949.

### CELERY

There were 4,863 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at March 1, there were 20 crates. Imported stocks on hand March 1, 1949 amounted to 13,631 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,075 tons, Carrots 9,077 tons, Cabbage 1,640 tons and Parsnips 702 tons.

### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and under" showed a total of 616,000 1b. while for "Over 1 1b." the total was 5,495,000 1b. There were 3,173,000 1b. held"In Brina".
