#### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - JUNE 1, 1949

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 431 barrels 133,940 boxes and 8,690 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 143,923 bushels as compared with 274,995 bushels as at June 1, 1948, and 362,648 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 218,725 bushels.

PEARS There were 311 bushels of pears on hand as compared with 1,793 bushels last month.

### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 271,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 8,206,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 15,643,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 15,859,000 lb. and last month to 17,668,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 26,683,000 lb. as compared with 22,476,000 lb. last year and 30,538,000 lb. last month.

#### VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 110,269 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 22,987 tons. Imported stocks were 258 tons.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 1,997 tons as compared with 835 tons last year and 4,504 tons last month. There were also 447 tons of imported onions on hand on June 1, 1949.

There were 3,759 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at June 1 there were no stocks of celery on hand. Imported stocks at June 1, 1949 amounted to 15,095 crates

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 502 tons, Carrots 522 tons
Cabbage 96 tons and Parsnips 53 tons. Imported stocks were:
Carrots 704 tons Cabbage 314 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 390,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 3,198,000 lb. There were 2,812,000 lb. held "In Brine"
