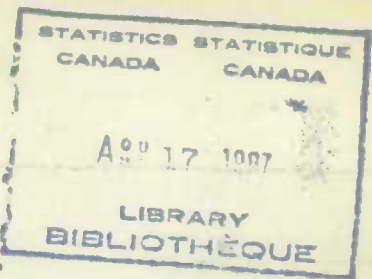

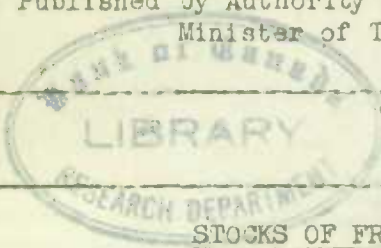

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - JULY 1, 1949

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 46 barrels, 42,977 boxes and 376 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 43,491 bushels as compared with 93,593 bushels as at July 1, 1948, and 143,923 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 100,432 bushels.

PEARS

There were no Canadian pears on hand July 1, 1949 as compared with 311 bushels last month.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 427,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.", the total was 11,213,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 16,031,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 15,144,000 lb. and last month to 16,332,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 30,014,000 lb. as compared with 28,913,000 lb. last year and 27,594,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 6,461 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 103,808 tons. Imported stocks were 93 tons.

ONION

Stocks of onions were reported as 522 tons as compared with 267 tons last year and 1,997 tons last month. There were also 453 tons of imported onions on hand on July 1, 1949.

CELERY

There were 4,231 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at July 1 there were no stocks of celery on hand. Imported stocks at July 1, 1949 amounted to 4,191 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 104 tons, Carrots 117 tons Cabbage 207 tons and Parsnips 4 tons. Imported stocks were: Carrots 316 tons Cabbage 83 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 329,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 2,655,000 lb. There were 2,220,000 lb. held "In Brine"
