STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - SEPTEMBER 1, 1949

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 368 barrels, 13,602 boxes and 10,505 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figures were 25,211 bushels as compared with 14,504 bushels as at September 1, 1948, and 9,073 bushels last month. The apparent net "intostorage" movement was 16,138 bushels.

PEARS There were 34,417 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand September 1, 1949.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 445,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the totel was 15,168,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 14,597,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 21,960,000 lb. and last month to 15,676,000 lb.

The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives, was 32,278,000 lb. as compared with 42,492,000 lb. last year and 32,450,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

- POTATO Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were: Stocks of potatoes were 2,032 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 579 tons.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 574 tons as compared with 814 tons last year and 382 tons last month. There were also 33 tons of imported onions on hand on September 1, 1949.
- <u>CELERY</u> There ware 6,720 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at September 1 there were 3,615 crates on hand. There were no stocks of imported celery on hand on September 1, 1949.
- OTRER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 118 tons, Carrots 177 tons, Cabbage 106 tons and Parsnips 8 tons. Imported stocks were: Carrots 16 tons and Cabbage 1 ton.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and Under" showed a total of 754,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 5,538,000 lb. There were 3,805,000 lb. held "In Brine". ANTIALA ADDAULT
