STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

JANUARY 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 34 A 518 barrels, 4.338,126 boxes and 1.535,552 bushels in other containers. Conventing all that diners to bushels the combined figure was 6,826,232 bushels as compared with 3,290,593 bushels as at January 1, 1949 and 8,919,616 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-ofstorage" movement was 2,093,384 bushels.

PEARS

There were 29,645 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand January 1, 1950. Imported Pears amounted to 546 bushels and apples to 602 bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 478,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 12,372,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 14,045,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 20,498,000 lb. and last month to 14,734,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 28,004,000 lb. as compared with 36,311,000 lb. last year and 30,714,000 lb. last month. VEGETABLES

Holdings of Janadian grown vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 614,641 tons, there being en "out-of-storage" POTATO movement of 71,941 tons. There were also 147 tons of imported

potatoes on hand January 1. 1950.

Stocks of onions were reported as 12,648 tons as compared with 20,324 ONION

tons last year and 16,778 tons last month. There were also 167 tons

of imported onions on hand on January 1, 1950.

There were 154,065 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at CELERY January 1 there were 54,882 crates. Imported celery on hand on

January 1, 1950 amounted to 3,129 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1943 tons, Carrots 10,669 tons, Cabbage 5526 tons and Parsnips 1783 tons. Imported stocks were: Beets 2 tons, Carrots 61 tons and Cabbage 77 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 863,000 lb. while for "Over 1 1b," the total was 6,119,000 lb. There were 3,589,000 lb. held "In Brine".
