

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - DECEMBER 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 8,101,000 bushels compared with 8,837,000 bushels last month and 8,920,000 bushels last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 736,000 bushels.

PEARS

There were 65,000 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on December 1, 1950.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 1,371,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 16,270,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 16,093,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 14,998,000 lb. and last month to 14,618,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 33,734,000 pounds as compared with 30,612,000 lb. last year and 32,641,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 21,955,000 bushels, there being an "out-ofstorage" movement of 1,091,000 bushels.

ONION

Stocks of onions were reported as 1,147,000 bushels as compared with 675,000 bushels last year and 1,286,000 bushels last month.

CARROTS

Stocks of carrots amounted to 615,000 bushels as compared with 477,000 bushels last month and 543,000 bushels last year.

CABBAGE

Stocks of cabbages increased to 361,000 bushels from 357,000 bushels last month.

CELERY

There were 224,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at December 1 there were 354,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 3,583,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 8,933,000 lb. There were 3,668,000 lb. held "In Brine".
