

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - MARCH 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 39,761 barrels, 1,730,833 boxes and 706,439 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 2,556,605 bushels as compared with 1,352,887 bushels as at March 1, 1949 and 5,004,513 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 2,447,908 bushels. There were 529 bushels of Imported apples on hand on March 1,1950.

PEARS

There were 1,240 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on March 1, 1950. Imported pears amounted to 3,858 bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 391,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 10,729,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 14,465,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 21,078,000 lb. and last month to 15,639,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 26,593,000 pounds as compared with 35,914,000 lb. last year and 29,084,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 431,670 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 86,258 tons. There were also 350 tons of imported potatoes on hand March 1,1950.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 6,260 tons as compared with 11,257 tons last year and 9,370 tons last month. There were also 821 tons of imported onions on hand on March 1, 1950.

CELERY There were 8,262 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at March 1, 1949 there were 4,863 crates. Imported celery on hand on March 1, 1950 amounted to 13,470 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 1,034 tons, Carrots 4,922 tons, Cabbage 1,719 tons and Parsnips 917 tons. Imported stocks were:

Beets 5 tons, Carrots 335 tons, Cabbage 296 tons and Parsnips 4 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 752,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 5,092,000 lb. There were 2,730,000 lb. held "In Brine".
