

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APRIL 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 13,401 barrels, 904,575 boxes and 359,395 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 1,304,173 bushels as compared with 740,359 bushels as at April 1, 1949 and 2,556,605 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 1,252 432 bushels. There were 5,268 bushels of Imported apples on hand on April 1, 1950.

PEARS

There were 687 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on April 1, 1950. Imported pears amounted to 4,389 bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 299,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 8,887,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 13,668,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 19,117,000 lb. and last month to 14,465,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 23,998,000 lb. as compared with 33,117,000 lb. last year and 26,572,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 338,403 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 93,267 tons. There were also 317 tons of imported potatoes on hand April 1, 1950.

ONION

Stocks of onions were reported as 2,888 tons as compared with 7,473 tons last year and 6,260 tons last month. There were also 431 tons of imported onions on hand on April 1, 1950.

CELERY

There were 1,836 crates of Canadian Celery on hand. Last year at April 1, 1949, there were 2,959 crates. Imported Celery on hand on April 1, 1950 amounted to 14,380 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 399 tons, Carrots 2,284 tons Cabbage 685 tons, and Parsnips 532 tons. Imported stocks were: Beets 29 tons, Carrots 489 tons, Cabbage 371 tons and Farsnips 11 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 805,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 4,369,000 lb. There were 2,240,000 lb. held "In Brine".
