

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - MAY 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 3,926 barrels 303,744 boxes and 132,035 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 447,557 bushels as compared with 362,648 bushels as at May 1, 1949 and 359,395 bushels last month. The apparent net "into-storage" movement was 88,162 bushels. There were 1,999 bushels of imported apples on hand on May 1, 1950.

PEARS

There were 39 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on May 1, 1950. Imported pears amounted to 1,935 bushels.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 214,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 8,689,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,604,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 17,679,000 lb. and last month to 13,620,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 20,507,000 lb. as compared with 30,553,000lb. last year and 23,913,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 224,892 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 113,511 tons. There were also 398 tons of imported potatoes on hand May 1, 1950.

ON ION

Stocks of onions were reported as 1,033 tons as compared with 4,504 tons last year and 2,888 tons last month. There were also 900 tons of imported onions on hand on May 1, 1950.

CELERY

There were 1,062 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at May 1 there were 2,014 crates. Imported celery on hand on May 1, 1950 amounted to 12,232 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 189 tons, Carrots 1,428 tons Cabbage 307 tons, and Parsnips 300 tons. Imported stocks were: Beets 61 tons Carrots 432 tons, Cabbage 332 tons, and Parsnips 1 ton.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 785,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 3,674,000 lb. There were 1,801,000 lb. held "In Brine".
