

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - JUNE 1, 1950

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,502 barrels 111,519 boxes and 13,493 bushels in other containers. Converting all containers to bushels the combined figure was 129,518 bushels as compared with 143,923 bushels as at June 1, 1949 and 132,035 bushels last month. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 2,517 bushels. There were 15,090 bushels of imported apples on hand on June 1, 1950.

PEARS

There were 16 bushels of Canadian Fears on hand on June 1, 1950.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 157,000 lb. of fruit, in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 6,938,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 10,369,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 16,469,000 lb. and last month to 11,593,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 17,464,000 lb. as compared with 27,597,000 lb. last year and 20,500,000 lb. last month.

VEGET ABLES

Holdings of Canadian grown vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 34,533 tons, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 190,359 tons. There were also 438 tons of imported potatoes on hand June 1, 1950.

ONION

Stocks of onions were reported as 427 tons as compared with 1,997 tons last year and 1,033 tons last month. There were also 846 tons of imported onions on hand on June 1, 1950.

CELERY

There were 1,490 crates of Canadian celery on hand. Last year at June 1 there were 3,759 crates. Imported celery on hand on June 1, 1950 amounted to 12,974 crates.

OTHER VEGETABLES were reported as follows: Beets 63 tons, Carrots 729 tons Cabbage 32 tons and Parsnips 47 tons. Imported stocks were: Beets 59 tons Carrots 658 tons, Cabbage 466 tons and Parsnips 49 tons.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 507,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 3,264,000 lb. There were 1,327,000 lb. held "In Brine".
