

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - APRIL 1, 1951

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,881,000 bushels compared with 3,114,000 bushels last month and 1,309,000 bushels last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 1,233,000 bushels.

PEARS There were 4,000 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on April 1, 1951.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 1,191,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 11,310,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 15,145,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 13,661,000 lb. and last month to 15,982,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 27,646,000 lb. as compared with 24,044,000 lb. last year and 28,942,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 9,991,000 bushels, there being an "out-of-storage" movement of 2,220,000 bushels.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 392,000 bushels as compared with 133,000 bushels last year and 587,000 bushels last month.

CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 155,000 bushels as compared with 270,000 bushels last month and 111,000 bushels last year.

CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages decreased to 25,000 bushels from 40,000 bushels last month.

CELERY There were 12,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at April 1 there were 16,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 2,782,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 6,674,000 lb. There were 2,860,000 lb. held "In Brine".
