

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - MAY 1, 1951

APPLES

Canadian epples held in cold and common storage were 857,000 bushels compared with 1,881,000 bushels last month and 450,000 bushels last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement was 1,024,000 bushels.

PEARS

There were 3,000 bushels of Canadian Pears on hand on May 1, 1951.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 953,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 10,037,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 13,433,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,633,000 lb. and last month to 15,163,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 24,423,000 lb. as compared with 20,543,000 lb. last year and 27,674,000 lb. last month.

VECETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

POTATO

Stocks of potatoes were 6,616,000 bushels, there being an "out-of storage" movement of 3,375,000 bushels.

ONION

Stocks of onions were reported as 203,000 bushels as compared with 77,000 bushels last year and 392,000 bushels last month.

CARROTS

Stocks of carrots amounted to 106,000 bushels as compared with 155,000 bushels last month and 74,000 bushels last year.

CARBAGE

Stocks of cabbages were 25,000 bushels.

CELERY

There were 14,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at May 1, there were also 14,000 crates.

VECETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 2,697,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb.". the total was 5,888,000 lb. There were 2,242,000 lb. held "In Brine".
