SOURCE AND CONTENT

The figures submitted herewith represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in farm storages of commercial growers.

Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Department of Agriculture, Stocks of fruit and vegetables, frozen and in preservatives are obtained by mail questionnaire.

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 4,941,000 bushels, compared with 5,282,000 bushels last year.

FEARS

There were 51,000 bushels of Pears on hand on December 1, 1952.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 2,033,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 15,021,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,572,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 14,320,000 lb. and last month to 11,862,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 28,626,000 lb. as compared with 38,322,000 lb. last year and 30,056,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 17,719,000 bushels, as compared with 13,941,000 bushels last year.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 820,000 bushels as compared with 570,000 bushels last year,

CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 893,000 bushels as compared with 666,000 bushels last year.

CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages increased to 311,000 bushels from 309,000 bushels last year.

CELERY There were 128,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at December 1 there were 184,000 crates.

VEGETALBES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 3,816,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 6,900,000 lb. There were 6,621,000 lb. held "In Brine."
