STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES - FEBRUARY 1, 1952

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2,578,000 bushels, compared with 4,511,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 33,000 bushels of pears on hand on February 1, 1952.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 2,770,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 18,150,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 13,620,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 16,364,000 lb. and last month to 13,898,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frezen and in preservatives was 34,540,000 lb. as compared with 31,216,000 lb. last year and 35,597,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

- POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 9,395,000 bushels, as compared with 16,383,000 bushels last year.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 230,000 bushels as compared with 735,000 bushels last year.
- CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 355,000 bushess as compared with 389.000 bushels last year.
- CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages decreased to 94,000 bushels from 149,000 bushels last year.
- CELERY There were 32,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at February 1 there were 22,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 2,617,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 8,421,000 lb. There were 3,044,000 lb. held "In Brine."
