Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Department of Agriculture, Stocks of fruit and vegetables, frozen and in preservatives are obtained by mail questionnaire.

#### APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 747,000 busels, compared with 683,000 bushels last year.

#### PEARS

There were 3,000 bushels of Pears on hand on April 1, 1953.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 1,089,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 10,569,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 10,712,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,845,000 lb. and last month to 11,931,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 22,370,000 lb. as compared with 29,363,000 lb. last year and 24,751,000 lb. last month.

#### VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

- POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 7,159,000 bushels, as compared with 5,001,000 bushels last year.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 107,000 bushels as compared with 45,000 bushels last year.
- CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 115,000 bushels as compared with 97,000 bushels last year.
- CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages decreased to 32,000 bushels from 36,000 bushels last year.
- CELERY There were 17,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at April 1 there were 18,000 crates.

#### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 2,216,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 4,514,000 lb. There were 4,284,000 lb. held "In Brine."
