SOURCE AND CONTENT

The figures submitted herewith represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in farm storages of commercial growers.

Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Department of Agriculture. Stocks of fruit and vegetables, frozen and in preservatives are obtained by mail questionnaire.

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 137,000 bushels, compared with 96,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 1,000 bushels of Pears on hand on June 1, 1953.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 448,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 6,930,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 8,289,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 10,145,000 lb. and last month to 9,580,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 15,667,000 lb. as compared with 22,517,000 lb. last year and 19,115,000 last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 1,957,000 bushels, as compared with 727,000 bushels last year.

ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 86,000 bushels as compared with 53,000 bushels last year.

CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 64,000 bushels as compared with 51,000 bushels last year.

CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages increased to 24,000 bushels from 21,000 bushels last year.

CELERY There were 10,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at June 1 there were 11,000 crates.

VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 1,906,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 3,866,0000 lb. There were 3,685,000 lb. held "In Brine."
