D.B.S. MEMORANDUM

SOURCE AND CONTENT

The figures submitted herewith represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in farm storages of commercial growers.

Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Department of Agriculture. Stocks of fruit and vegetables, frozen and in preservatives are obtained by mail questionnaire.

APPLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 3,656,000 bushels, compared with 3,769,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 74,000 bushels of Pears on hand on January 1, 1954.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 2,956,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 14,927,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,951,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,218,000 lb. and last month to 11,798,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 29,854,000 lb. as compared with 28,776,000 lb. last year and 32,353,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES

Holdings of vegetables were:

- POTATO Stocks of potatoes were 19,936,000 bushels, as compared with 17,561,000 bushels last year.
- ONION Stocks of onions were reported as 847,000 bushels as compared with 565,000 bushels last year.
- CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 618,000 bushels as compared with 595,000 bushels last year.
- CABBAGE Stocks of cabbages decreased to 185,000 bushels from 200,000 bushels last year.
- CELERY There were 52,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at January I there were 35,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 5,485,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 11,119,000 lb. There were 5,399,000 lb. held: "In Brine."
