### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2,698,000 bushels, compared with 2,929,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 53,000 bushels of Pears on hand on February 1. 1954.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 4,970,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb," the total was 15,727,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 11,849,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,577,000 lb. and last month to 11,849,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 32,546,000 lb. as compared with 28,215,000 lb. last year and 29,922,000 1b. last month.

Holdings of vegetables were: VEGETABLES

POTATOES Stocks of potatoes were 15,886,000 bushels, as compared with 14,682,000 bushels last year.

Stocks of onions were reported as 654,000 bushels as compared ONIONS with 407,000 bushels last year.

CARROTS Stocks of carrots amounted to 396,000 bushels as compared with 432,000 bushels last year.

CAHBAGE Stocks of cabbages decreased to 101,000 bushels from 137,000 bushels last year.

CELERY There were 23,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at February 1 there were 22,000 crates.

### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

\*Containers 1 lb. and Under showed a total of 5,927,000 lb. while for "Over 1 1b." the total was 9,023,000 1b. There were 5,088,000 lb, held "In Brine."
