#### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,042,000 bushels, compared with 747,000 bushels last year,

PEARS

There were 16,000 bushels of Pears on hand on April 1. 1954.

#### FRUIT FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 3,138,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 12,275,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 9,802,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,034,000 lb. and last month to 11,329,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 25,215,000 lb. as compared with 22,713,000 lb. last year and 29,487,000 lb. last month.

#### VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 10,023,000 bushels, as compared with 9,666,000 bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 202,000 bushels as compared with 107,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 114,000 bushels as compared with 115,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbages increased to 34,000 bushels from 32,000 bushels last year. There were 18,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at April 1 there were 17,000 crates.

#### VEGETABLES FROZEN AND IN BRINE

\*Containers 1 lb. and Under showed a total of 5,563,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 9,252,000 lb. There were 4,729,000 lb. held "In Brine."

#### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
