STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 201,000 bushels, compared with 137,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 3,000 bushels of Pears on hand on June 1, 1954.

FRUIT TROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 2,180,000 lb, of fruit in "Containers 1 lb, and Under" while for "Over 1 1b," the total was 8,722,000 1b.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 8,193,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 8,641,000 lb. and last month to 8,635,000 lb, The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 19,095,000 1b, as compared with 16,069,000 Ib, last year and 21,513,000 1b. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 1,953,000 bushels, as compared with 2,960,000 bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 82,000 bushels as compared with 86,000 bushels last year, Stocks of carrots: amounted to 69,000 bushels as compared with 64,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbages increased to 33,000 bushels from 24,000 bushels last year. There were 14,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at June 1. there were 10,000 crates.

VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b, and Under" showed a total of 4,760,000 1b. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 7,041,000 lb. There were 3,925,000 1b. held "In Brine."

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors. cold storages, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. 1/ Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture,
