APYMES
Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 8,451,000 bushels, compared with 7,691,000 bushels last year.

PEARS There were 277,000 bushels of Pears on hand on November 1, 1955. FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 6,046,000 1b. Of fruit in "Containers 1 1b and Under" while for "Over 1 lb ." the total was $20,406,000 \mathrm{lb}$.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled $12,164,000 \mathrm{lb}$. A year ago they amounted to $12,898,000 \mathrm{lb}$. and last month to $12,182,000 \mathrm{lb}$. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was $38,616,000 \mathrm{lb}$. 28 compared with $40,612,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year and 41,512,000 1b. last month.

VEGFIABLES Holdings of vegetables were:
Stocks of potatoes were $28,011,000$ bushels, as compared with $23,408,000$ bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 824,000 bushels as compered with 664,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 746,000 bushels as compared with 579,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 201,000 bushels from 622,000 bushels last year. There were 150,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at November 1, there were 185,000 crates.

## VEGETABLES, FROZAN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and Under" showed a total of 8,334,000 1b. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was $15,621,0001 \mathrm{~b}$. There were 7,276,000 1b. held "In Brine."

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through tre inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
