

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 7,667,000 bushels, compared with 6,232,000 bushels last year.

PEARS There were 69,000 bushels of Pears on hand on December 1, 1955.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 5,531,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 20,758,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,026,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 12,706,000 lb. and last month to 12,388,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 38,315,000 lb. as compared with 38,780,000 lb. last year and 38,814,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 25,132,000 bushels, as compared with 19,950,000 bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 638,000 bushels as compared with 463,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 681,000 bushels as compared with 497,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 152,000 bushels from 218,000 bushels last year. There were 71,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at December 1. there were 64,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 1b. and Under" showed a total of 7,684,000 1b. while for "Over 1 1b." the total was 12,993,000 1b. There were 6,520,000 1b. held "In Brine."

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
