## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2,914,000 bushels, compared with 2,698,000 bushels last year.

There were 28,000 bushels of Pears on hand on February 1, 1955.

### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 4,006,000 lb, of fruit in "Containers 1 lb, and Under" while for "Over 1 lb," the total was 18,560,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,612,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,943,000 lb. and last month to 12,053,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 35,178,000 lb. as compared with 32,427,000 lb. last year and 36,754,000 lb. last month.

## <u>VEGETABLES</u> Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 12,854,000 bushels, as compared with 15,886,000 bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 225,000 bushels as compared with 654,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 210,000 bushels as compared with 396,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 85,000 bushels from 101,000 bushels last year. There were 21,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at February 1, there were 23,000 crates.

#### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
