STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABIES

APPTES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 1,924,000 bushels, compared with $1,867,000$ bushels last year.

PEARS There were 12,000 bushels of Pears on hand on March 1, 1955.

## FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 3,587,000 1b. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb . and Under" while for "Over 1 lb ." the total was $18,508,000 \mathrm{lb}$.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda togh 11 ed $11,778,000 \mathrm{lb}$. A year ago they amounted to $11,415,000 \mathrm{lb}$. and last morth to 11,913,000 1b. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives ands $33,873,000 \mathrm{lb}$. as compared with $29,898,000 \mathrm{lb}$. last year and $34,468,000$ \$7b last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:


Stocks of potatoes were $10,296,000$ bushels, as compared with 12,947,000 bushels last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 162,000 "bushels as compared with 461,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 131,000 bushels as compared with 242,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 50,000 bushels from 65,000 bushels last year. There were 23,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at March 1, there were 19,000 crates.

## VEGETABLES. FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb . and Under" showed a total of $5,874,000 \mathrm{lb}$. while for "Over 1 lb ." the total was 7,802,000 lb . There were 3,191,000 lb . held In Brine."

## NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors, cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
