

STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPLES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 7,200,000 bushels, compared with 5,714,000 bushels last year.

PEARS There were 106,000 bushels of Fears on hand on December 1, 1957.

FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 6,282,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 20,640,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled 12,662,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 11,560,000 lb. and last month 12,099,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 39,584,000 lb. as compared with 34,779,000 lb. last year and 40,310,000 lb. last month.

VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 16,660,000 hundredweight, as compared with 15,069,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 805,000 bushels as compared with 613,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 560,000 bushels as compared with 824,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage decreased to 149,000 bushels from 198,000 bushels last year. There were 47,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at December 1 there were 42,000 crates.

VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 13,814,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 24,316,000. There were 7,153,000 lb. held "In Brine."

NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholeselers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
