## STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

## APFLESS

Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 2，012，000 bushels，compared with 2，347，000 bushels last year．

PRARS There were 25，000 bushels of Pears on hand on March 1， 1957.

## FRUIT，FROZNN AND IN PRRESTRVATIVES

There were $4,252,000 \mathrm{lb}$ 。of fruit in＂Containers 1 lb ．and Under＂while for＂Over $1 \mathrm{lb} \mathrm{b}^{\prime \prime}$ the total was $14,574,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of soda totalled $11,447,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．A year ago they amunted to $12,634,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．and last month $11,753,000 \mathrm{lb}$ 。 The total of all fruit，frozen and in preserv－ atives was $30,173,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．as compared with $34,526,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ，last year and 31，552，000 1b。last month．

## VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were：

Stocks of potatoes were $13,584,000$ bushels，as compared with 12，436，000 bushels last year．Stocks of onions were reported as 157，000 bushels as compared with 156,000 bushels last year．Stocks of carrots amounted to 305,000 bushels as compared with 154,000 bushels last year． Stocks of cabbage increased to 42,000 bushels from 35,000 bushels last year．There were 23,000 crates of celery on hand．Last year at March 1 there were 20,000 crates．

## VEGETABLES，FROZEN AND IN BRINE

＂Containers 1 lb 。 and Under＂showed a total of $12,530,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ． while for＂Over 1 lb ．＂the total was $13,039,000 \mathrm{lb}$ ．There were 3，139，000 1b．held＂In Brine．＂

## NOTE AS TO SOURCB AND CONTENTT

The data contained in this report repreaent atocks of fruit and vegetables；fresh，frozen and in preservatives，held by food pro－ cessors cold storage，fruit warehouses，wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production．Invent－ ories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture．
