#### STOCKS OF FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

APPIES Canadian apples held in cold and common storage were 212,000 bushels, compared with 252,000 bushels last year.

PEARS

There were 10,000 bushels of Pears on hand on June 1, 1958.

#### FRUIT, FROZEN AND IN PRESERVATIVES

There were 2,961,000 lb. of fruit in "Containers 1 lb. and Under" while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 14,448,000 lb.

The stocks of fruit in sulphur dioxide or in benzoate of

soda totalled 6,071,000 lb. A year ago they amounted to 9,111,000 lb. and last month 7,066,000 lb. The total of all fruit, frozen and in preservatives was 23,480,000 lb. as compared with 22,581,000 lb. last year and 26,897,000 lb. last month.

#### VEGETABLES Holdings of vegetables were:

Stocks of potatoes were 1,818,000 hundredweight, as compared with 1,820,000 hundredweight last year. Stocks of onions were reported as 70,000 bushels as compared with 51,000 bushels last year. Stocks of carrots amounted to 86,000 bushels as compared with 76,000 bushels last year. Stocks of cabbage increased to 34,000 bushels from 22,000 bushels last year. There were 17,000 crates of celery on hand. Last year at June 1 there were 17,000 crates.

#### VEGETABLES, FROZEN AND IN BRINE

"Containers 1 lb. and Under" showed a total of 9,047,000 lb. while for "Over 1 lb." the total was 12,629,000 lb. There were 3,258,000 lb. held "In Brine".

### NOTE AS TO SOURCE AND CONTENT

The data contained in this report represent stocks of fruit and vegetables; fresh, frozen and in preservatives, held by food processors cold storage, fruit warehouses, wholesalers and in storages of commercial growers in certain areas of commercial production. Inventories of fresh fruit and vegetables are obtained through the inspection services of the Canada Department of Agriculture.
